DIVINE NEWSLINE MAY 2024 THE FEAST DAY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

On May 13, 2024, we celebrate the Feast Day of Our Lady of Fatima. On May 13th, in the year 1917, the Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, Francisco Marto, and Jacinta Marto, near Fatima, Portugal. They were tending sheep in a field, about 70 miles northeast of Lisbon, when they had a vision of a woman surrounded by light who identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary. Following the initial event, the children saw the vision five more times, once each month, continuing through October. During her appearances, Our Lady of Fatima gave the children three secrets and repeatedly exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace. She emphasized the necessity of devotions to her Immaculate Heart in order for souls to be saved.

What is the prayer for adoration of Fatima?

Fatima Prayers – Saint Mary of Sorrows. My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! I beg pardon for those who do not believe, nor adore, nor hope, nor love You. Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly. Amen.

What is the Fatima Prayer to the Most Holy Trinity?

Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly. I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifference by which He is offended. Amen.

What is the prayer for Our Lady of Fatima?

O My Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to Heaven, especially those most in need of Thy mercy. Amen. Why is it important to pray the Fatima prayer?


