

As we continue to navigate during the pandemic, our homeless guests will not be staying with us this year. The MCREST guests have been staying in a motel near the MCREST offices. This has not only provided them with shelter but also by being close to the MCREST offices, they can easily meet with their case managers on their plans to get back on their feet again. Sponsoring churches like us are still helping out by providing assistance with meals and needed supplies.
