Principal's Corner

Dear Parents.

We're off to a very cold new year, but we're still so happy to be back in school with our students. As I've shared, there have been changes again to Covid school policy where students exposed to Covid-positive students no longer have to quarantine. I also just shared this week that there are illnesses other than Covid that may warrant keeping your children home if they are sick. I appreciate everyone's cooperation in continuing to be vigilant in doing our parts to keep our kids healthy and in school.

This Sunday is our Open House and the start of Catholic Schools Week. Current families can check out the scholarship opportunity being offered from the Knights of Columbus in this newsletter. In addition, online tuition assistance applications are now available through the AOD on the Facts portal (not through the school). While we unfortunately can't give tours of the new middle school building during Open House per the fire marshall, the renovation is just beautiful and we hope to make similar changes to the elementary school over time. We will be transferring our 6th-8th grade students just as soon as DTE completes some final work. Once they move, Specials classes will move back into classrooms, students will each have their own locker and K-5th graders will start having lunch in the cafeteria.



The SVDP truck will be located in the back of the church parking lot near the current donation box. Our donation box has been overflowing recently, so please hold your donations until this date.


