Seven Areas of Development for a Student

At St. Lawrence Nursery School and Preschool, we develop the whole child. Our curriculum is age-appropriate and individually-appropriate. We focus on developing your child through The Creative Curriculum for Preschool. This curriculum is a research-based system that features exploration and discovery as a way of learning, enabling children to develop confidence, creativity and lifelong critical thinking skills. The children are immersed in learning though purposeful play-based experiences on topics they are familiar in their everyday lives.

<u>Spiritual Development</u> - We strive to develop the child's love for Jesus in their everyday life. We do this through prayer, bible stories, songs, learning the religious significance of holidays, and community service.

<u>Social and Emotional Development</u> - This is the child's growth in relating to others; playing, working, sharing, and communicating.

<u>Self-Awareness and Work Habits</u> - Development of the child's self- concept, self-confidence, independence, and responsibility is extremely important for future success in life.

<u>Language and Auditory Development</u> - This area focuses on how a child hears and understands the world and communicates his/her thoughts and ideas to others.

Fine Motor Development - Activities which develop muscles of the fingers, hands and wrists help with writing skills.

<u>Gross Motor Development</u> - This area includes activities that develop coordination and balance.

<u>Cognitive Development</u> - Most people focus on this in academics: it shows development of thinking skills.
