ASSISTANT'S PRINCIPLES

Welcome to the new school year! I am so happy to have you back, and I want to welcome our new students and their families into the St. Lawrence family. For those who do not know me, let me introduce myself. My name is Mrs. Julie Tsatsos, and this is my 20th year at St. Lawrence. I have taught 1st and 2nd grade, served as the reading intervention specialist, and as the instructional coach. This summer I completed my master's degree in educational leadership to prepare myself for this new role as the assistant principal. I look forward to working closely with the principal, staff, parents, and students to create a safe, supportive learning environment for everyone.

As many of you know, to better prepare the teachers to meet the needs of your children, September is a month of assessment. We are in the middle of the first round of STAR testing, which is a standardized test that measures students' skills and knowledge in reading and math. Being a computer-based, adaptive test, the questions adjust to each student's performance, providing us with a more accurate assessment of each student's strengths and weaknesses. This means that parents and teachers get better feedback on how to help them improve. Don't look at it like a test; look at it more like a tool to help all of us be more successful together. Testing will conclude on October 6th.

There are some changes that you will notice as the year progresses. Last year we introduced the new MyView reading series for grades K-5, which is based on the Science of Reading. This year, we will incorporate the assessment tool that is integrated in this series. Some of you may be unfamiliar with the Science of Reading. Teachers will combine phonics and vocabulary with oral language, writing, and reading, helping students develop the skills they need to become proficient and confident readers.







Holy Guardian Angels

On Monday, October 2, 2023, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast Day of the Holy Guardian Angels.

This feast was first observed in the 16th century. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar.

As a silent and trustworthy advisor, our Guardian Angel stays by our side, trying to advise us for the best, to suggest the right path to follow, to obtain salvation, to deserve Paradise, and above all to be good people and always behave as good Catholic Christians.

According to Christian tradition, every one of us has a Guardian Angel, who accompanies us from the moment we're born until the moment of our death, and stays at our side at every moment of our life. The idea of a spirit, of a supernatural entity that follows and supervises every human being, was already present in other religions and in Greek philosophy. In the Old Testament, we can read that God is surrounded by a genuine court of heavenly figures who worship Him and perform actions in His name. Even in these ancient books, there are frequent references to angels sent by God as protectors of people and individuals, as well as messengers. In the Gospel, lesus invites us to respect even the smallest and humble, in a reference to their angels, who watch over them from heaven and contemplate the face of God at every moment.

The Guardian Angel, therefore, is linked to anyone who lives within God's grace. The Fathers of the Church, like Tertullian, Saint Augustine, Saint Ambrose, Saint John Chrysostom, Saint Jerome and Saint Gregory of Nyssa, maintained that a Guardian Angel existed for each person, and although there was not yet a dogmatic formulation concerning this figure, already during the Council of Trent (1545 – 1563), it was stated that every human being had their own angel.

From the seventeenth century onwards, the spread of popular devotion increased and Pope Paul V added the festival of Guardian Angels to the calendar.




In sacred representations, and above all, in the images of popular devotion, Guardian Angels began to appear, and were usually depicted in the act of protecting children from harm. In fact, it is especially by children that we are encouraged to talk with our Guardian Angels, and to address our prayers to them. As we grow up, this blind trust, this unconditional love towards an invisible yet extraordinarily reassuring presence, fades. These Guardian Angels have always been and will continue to be near us.

Here are several fun facts and information about our Guardian Angel:

- 1) Guardian Angels exist and we all have one.
- 2) Angels have always existed and our Guardian Angel is not the spirit of a dead person.
- 3) Our Guardian Angel guides us on the pathway to Heaven and never abandons us.
- 4) Our Guardian Angel has no name.
- 5) Our Guradian Angel defends us with all his strength.
- Our Guardian Angel is our personal messenger, charged with bringing our messages to God, and vice versa.
